Serving as the hub for all IBEW political contributions, the PAC enables the Government Affairs Department to impact decisions that affect the members of the IBEW and the officials who make those decisions by driving a policy agenda to benefit IBEW members. This includes:

IBEW PAC FAQs

Which party does IBEW PAC support?

IBEW PAC is bipartisan and supports labor-friendly candidates from both sides of the political aisle.

To whom does IBEW PAC donate?

IBEW PAC donates to candidates and committees at the local, state, and federal levels.

Who decides which candidate my contribution will support?

Your local union officers decide how contributions to the IBEW PAC from its members should be spent.

How does IBEW PAC get funded?

IBEW PAC is financed through voluntary contributions from hundreds of thousands of IBEW members throughout the United States.

Are my dues used to support political candidates?

No, the IBEW does not use national treasury money to contribute directly to candidates for office.

Why should I support IBEW PAC?

According to the Center for Responsive Politics, a nonpartisan research group, corporations spent \$5.9 billion on political contributions in the 2020 election cycle, nearly 16 times more than labor.

GET INVOLVED WITH IBEW PAC

- 1 Contact your local union to see if they have a political check-off system in place.** Many local unions have a voluntary program where you can sign up to have money deducted from your paycheck on an hourly or weekly basis that is sent to the IBEW PAC.
- 2 Talk to your local union leadership about establishing a local union political action committee.** This committee should operate under the direction of the business manager. The local union PAC would educate local union members on political candidates and issues while also making endorsements and contributions.
- 3 Donate directly to the IBEW PAC.** Use the QR code below to go to the IBEW PAC Contribution Center where you can make a one time contribution or sign up for reoccurring contributions. Funds received by you are credited to your local union to be requested by officers to support local candidates.
